Dear Taylor Community,

This afternoon Governor Sununu is expected to announce his comprehensive plan to re-open New Hampshire's economy. What exactly this phased-in approach includes remains to be seen. I do expect that he will extend the stay-at-home order past May 4th. Today, I am announcing the first small step, in what will be a series of steps, back to a new normal here at Taylor Community.

As of Monday, May 18th, we will re-open campus for Independent Residents—allowing you to come and go from campus without being subject to a 14 day self-quarantine for leaving. This does not include those who are returning to campus from out of state. Those returning to campus from out of state will still be asked to self-quarantine for 14 days. All other precautions currently in place at Taylor Community will remain in effect and campus will remain closed to non-essential visitors.

Some of you may think that this approach is too conservative. Others may feel that it is too aggressive. What I know for sure is that we can't operate this way forever, and this first step is our effort to methodically re-open things here at Taylor Community. Please recognize that should COVID-19 appear on campus, this decision could be reversed. Please also realize that our re-opening plan could also be accelerated to earlier than May 18th should Governor Sununu and officials from the NH Department of Health & Human Services provide guidance suggesting that this is prudent.

Again, I thank you for your continued patience and understanding through these uncharted waters. Every decision we make is with your healthy and well-being in mind.
