Dear Taylor Community,

Not a day goes by without a resident expressing appreciation for Team Taylor's hard work. Many on our team have stepped outside of their comfort zones and taken on new responsibilities lately. Others are doing their same jobs but working with increased precautions in place. All are essential front line workers who find ways every day to do the little things that mean so much to our residents. This level of service and care is something we have come to expect from them.

Please know that Taylor Community aims to care for our Team as well as they care for our residents. As a private, non-profit organization that is not Medicaid funded, our organization did not qualify for the weekly front line care worker stipends offered by the State of New Hampshire's Long Term Care Stabilization Fund. Nonetheless, we worked diligently to obtain funds from the Federal CARES Act Payroll Protection Plan and chose to immediately invest those resources in Team Taylor—our most valuable asset. We are paying a Health Emergency Shift Differential for all hourly staff and a daily bonus for all salary staff. This is in addition to the monthly Coronavirus Perfect Attendance bonus that we offer. We believe strongly in making these investments, as they reward the hard work and dedication of our team of over 180 full-time and part-time employees.

A lot of you have been asking me how you can personally express your thanks to Team Taylor. While our staff cannot accept gifts or tips of any kind, please know that gifts to the Sunshine Fund are a wonderful vehicle to say thank you. These funds are distributed to employees annually in December based upon hours worked. More information on the Sunshine Fund can be found on the back page of today's Daily News.

My continued thanks to our team for their exceptional efforts during these extraordinary times. I could not be more proud to work alongside all of you.
