

In Afghanistan, a culture ruled almost entirely by men, the birth of a son is cause for celebration and the arrival of a daughter is often mourned as misfortune. A bacha posh (literally translated from Dari as "dressed up like a boy") is a third kind of child—a girl temporarily raised as a boy and presented as such to the outside world. Jenny Nordberg, the reporter who broke the story of this phenomenon for the New York Times, constructs a powerful and moving account of those secretly living on the other side of a deeply segregated society where women have almost no rights and little freedom.


The Underground Girls of Kabul is anchored by vivid characters who bring this remarkable story to life: Azita, a female parliamentarian who sees no other choice but to turn her fourth daughter Mehran into a boy; Zahra, the tomboy teenager who struggles with puberty and refuses her parents' attempts to turn her back into a girl;

Shukria, now a married mother of three after living for twenty years as a man; and Nader, who prays with Shahed, the undercover female police officer, as they both remain in male disguise as adults.

At the heart of this emotional narrative is a new perspective on the extreme sacrifices of Afghan women and girls against the violent backdrop of America's longest war. Divided into four parts, the book follows those born as the unwanted sex in Afghanistan, but who live as the socially favored gender through childhood and puberty, only to later be forced into marriage and childbirth. She resides on a small farm and apothecary in North Sandwich, NH, where she practices wildcrafting and explores indigenous and folk healing traditions. Set in the aftermath of the Civil War, Etched in Granite follows three intertwined narratives: Abigail,

a young woman forced by betrayal and hardship into life at the Poor Farm; Nellie, an Abenaki elder and healer facing loss amid social and racial intolerance; and Silas, a farm boss struggling to balance authority, personal values, and small-town politics. Originally conceived as nonfiction, the novel was reimagined as historical fiction to bring broader awareness to the forgotten lives buried in an unmarked pauper cemetery in Ossipee, NH. Charlie's growth as a musician and music educator. Charlie also studied with such major jazz figures as Jerry Bergonzi, Charlie Mariano, Jerry Coker, and Ted Casher. Over the course of his career, Charlie has also taught applied music as well as music courses in jazz and harmony at UNH and Granite State College, with additional teaching engagements at Dartmouth College, University of New Hampshire, at St. Paul's School.

Bassist John Hunter has enjoyed a busy freelance and teaching career for forty plus years. He has performed in concerts and television appearances from Maine to San Francisco while accompanying such jazz greats as Dizzy Gillespie, Clark Terry, Slide Hampton, Sheila Jordan, Lennie Breau, Toshiko Akiyoshi, Eddie Daniels, Jimmy Heath, James Moody, and many others. He is a frequent performer with the Granite State Symphony, Portland Symphony Pops, Clearlake's Chorale, and is a member of the newly formed Capital Jazz Orchestra, which toured the eastern U.S with Ken Peplowski in the fall of 2013. John has toured and recorded albums with Andy Happel, the Barbara London Quartet, David Demsey, the Brandywine Singers, and he was heard in concert with the Shaw Brothers folk group for twenty years, and was featured on their National PBS television special.



Becoming Wolf: The Eastern Coyote in New England




